FROM THE PRESIDENT – Larry Couch

Your Board of Directors is working on the 2018/2019 Desert Aire Owner's Association budget and annual ballot. The annual meeting packet will be mailed to members in late May. For the past several years we have held a question and answer session two weeks before the annual meeting to discuss the ballot. We think this informal discussion helps clarify many of the issues included on the ballot. This year, we plan on having a similar meeting on Saturday, June 9, 2018 at 4:00PM downstairs in the Multi-Purpose Building. Bring any questions or comments you may have. We hope to see you there.

One of the things we address at the meeting concerns the Board's position on the various ballot items. Just because something is included on the ballot does not necessarily mean that the Board majority is in favor of it. Some items are placed on the ballot by the Board. Other items, which the Board may agree or disagree with, are placed on the ballot through motions made by members at last year's annual meeting and other items submitted by members not later than May 1, 2018, and subsequently approved by the Board to be included. The ballot will show if the Board majority approved or disapproved each item. You, as the voter should consider each item on its own merit.

Some issues that are still in discussion and may be placed on this year's ballot are:

- Multiple various revisions to DAOA By-Laws, CC&R's and/or Architectural Regulations

There will be three openings on the DAOA Board of Directors again this year. A term on the Board lasts three years. We need members who are willing to help their community by taking an active role on the Board and the various committees. If you are interested in making this commitment, please submit a letter of interest and resume of not more than 150 words to the DAOA office by the end of business on May 1, 2018. Your name will be placed on this year's ballot in the order which it is received.

Also, as stated above, if you have any suggested revisions or additions to our Governing Documents, those need to be submitted to the office no later than end of business on April 18, 2018. All suggested revisions or additions need to be submitted in succinct language referencing the appropriate document accordingly.

The swimming pool will open for the season Saturday, May 19th at 10am.

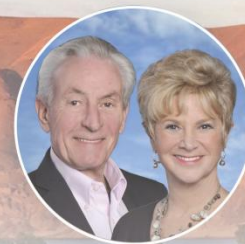
REMINDER that the pool is **closed during the week** until school is out Tuesday, June 12th.

From the Grant County Sheriff

To all Golf Cart Owners:

We will now be doing the cart renewal process by mail. You will find the form for both renewal and first time licenses on the Grant County website at the following URL:
<http://www.grantcountywa.gov/SHERIFF/Records/Golf-Carts.htm>. We are utilizing the same form with a few things added.

First Time Licenses: The Grant County Sheriff's Office no longer conducts golf cart inspections. Owners are responsible for installing required equipment to operate a golf cart on a roadway. Equipment requirements are listed on the form linked below. Once approved, the registration decal will be sent to you.

Please fill out the form in its entirety as legibly as possible with the current and correct information. Once we have received the form and money we will mail you back the registration and the sticker along with a short informational letter and county ordinance. The sticker will need to be visible on the rear of the cart.

Renewals: Just as before, the form will need to be filled out in its entirety as legibly as possible with the current and correct information. Please be sure the current registration number (example 13GC001) is on the form along with current registered owner's name, which is on the registration you were given when the cart was inspected. Once that form is completed, the form and the fee of \$35 will need to be mailed to Charity Sainsbury at the address listed on the inspection form.

If the information you provide does not match the current cart registration, and we are unable to verify the renewal, your form and money will be returned for you to resubmit with the correct information before it can be processed.

Once we have received the form and the money we will mail you back the registration and the sticker for you to place on the rear of your cart.

Kick off the Father's Day weekend with a hardy breakfast of pancakes, sausage, eggs, hot coffee, cold juice, displays, raffles, music and of course, lots of airplanes. Raffles will include airplane rides and other great offerings from our community. All donations help the volunteer staff pay for the airport lighting, windsocks and repairs on the airport. Airport Commissioners Karl Gruber and Vince Himsl met with the DAOA Golf Club House remodel committee chaired by Debra Pike and Gary Varney to provide airport input. A lot was talked about but the message Karl and Vince most wanted to convey was one of excitement at what this committee is trying to accomplish.

The US Department of Energy and Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL) recently came calling as they are looking for an airport from which to launch their new research drone for atmospheric testing over the Yakima Firing Center this spring.

They talked with Karl Gruber in his capacity as airport manager. The Drone, code named the ArcticShark, has a 22 foot wing-span, can carry up to 100 pounds of instruments and can climb to 18,000 feet. If things work out you should see it operating from Desert Aire Regional sometime this spring. Karl tried to get them to fly over Desert Aire for pictures but this particular drone is not allowed to fly over populated areas except for takeoff and landings. YouTube has a video, search ArcticShark.

As for other news, the airport traffic pattern realignment has been completed. March 29th was the effective change over date. An airport traffic pattern dictates how airplanes approach, circle and land and depart Desert Aire Regional. The previous pattern attempted to keep aircraft north of the airport. With power lines and low flying jets to the east, the Yakima firing center to the west, and vastly more housing to the north, the commissioners voted to return to the standard FAA airport traffic pattern. The expectation is that this will

reduce both traffic and noise above Desert Aire (both sides of the runway) and increase aviation safety. If you have questions you can contact Commissioner Karl Gruber who is also our airport manager.

Community Spotlight: Bill & Judy Norberg

Bill and Judy Norberg bought their property at Desert Aire in 1985. They had been looking for some recreational property, preferably with a golf course, when their next-door neighbor in Renton suggested Desert Aire. He owned property at Sunland and was familiar with Desert Aire.

The Norbergs came over to take a look around and after seeing several properties, they were given a free round of golf. As they prepared to play, two gentlemen just ahead of them asked Judy & Bill to join them. They were Bob Krautkremer and Keith Gilchrist, who became the Norbergs' first friends here. At that time, the Norbergs had an 11 and a half-foot camp trailer. Soon after, they bought a 29-foot travel trailer, and finally put their current home on the lot in 1996.

Together the Norbergs built their garage, mostly by themselves, with help raising walls and setting trusses. While Bill is very knowledgeable when it comes to construction, it was Judy's first time at that kind of work. Bill drew plans, received approvals from the Architectural Committee, and helped build many more garages in Desert Aire, including Bob Krautkremer's and Keith Gilchrist's. Bill was active in the Men's Club, held various offices and helped with course improvement projects including laying sod on new tee boxes. He also drew up plans and prepared the Architectural committee packages for the renovation of the cook shack and for

the Bathroom Facility at the #1 tee box and of course, worked on constructing both.

Often, the Men's club would organize a work party to paint a garage or a house for each other, or for a resident who needed help. Bill was President of the Country Club for 4 years and, during those years, the Club Championship was much more of an event, including a steak dinner at the park pavilion with special tables set for the winners.

Judy always supported Bill and handled all the entertaining at their property back then. During those years, there were many activities and lots of fun times at their home.

They had a group of 8 couples (Boeing friends), for long weekends of golf and party time; one-club tournaments in the evening-playing holes 1, 2, 8, and 9 (those are the four golf holes closest to their home)

They also held annual "Kent Days" events. Bill is from Kent, as are many other people at Desert Aire. They organized a two-day tournament with all the Desert Aire residents, along with the many mutual friends each resident invited; and also Saturday night dinners at the Norbergs'. For the most part, Bill & Judy were the youngest in each group, and like many, time is catching up with us all. Judy & Bill and their friends have many wonderful memories!!

These days with the passing of time, Judy has become more active in the community: she serves on the board of the Ladies Club and was Vice-President for 4 years; she was "Queen" of the Red Hat Club for several years until that ran its course; she volunteered on the Senior Center Board for three years, took a break and is currently back on that board.

Bill just turned 79 and Judy will be 77 in April. Between activities at the Club House and the Senior Center, Judy peruses her passion of decorating for parties and holidays. That is how Judy spends much of her time now, creating beautiful decorations for many events. Judy says she expects that she will be decorating at her own funeral!!

A Short Desert Aire History Lesson

Many new people have moved to Desert Aire and may be curious as to how this Grant County designated "Rural Village" came into existence.

*In the early 1970s, a group of investors led by Harry Davidson, of Harry Davidson, Inc., bought 3,200 acres of land along the Columbia River near the Priest Rapids Dam for about \$1,000,000. They developed a planned community of some 1,600 homes centered on a golf course and marina. In 1994 the Grant County Airport District was formed and now maintains the small public-use airstrip in the community.

Watermaster Report – Chris Guillen

The new line on Golf Court passed the leak and pressure tests. These tests ensure that the new line will not leak or fall apart due to pressure. On the pressure test, the line is pumped up to one and a half times its operating pressure and must hold for one hour.

The coliform samples have been taken and came back negative.

The new main has now been tied-in to the water system. The road crossing on Desert Aire Drive will be repaired when hot mix is available.

I have just completed my recertification for backflow assembly testing and now my certification is good for another three years. This certification is only good for a reporting period and I must be retested to keep my certification current. The recertification test is a practical exam where the test procedures are very strict and must be followed to the letter. Test-takers have 1 hour to test the 4 different assemblies.

We had a leak survey team in this week to see if they can find any leaks. We do this every 5 years to help keep our water loss down to less than 10%. The last time they were here they found several leaks. One of the leaks they found was about 18 gallons a minute. There was no water coming to the surface on that leak. Some of the leaks in Desert Aire can lose a lot of water and we would never see it, thanks to our very porous "soil".

Just as a reminder, the water policy effective August 1st 2009, states members are not to access the meter boxes in any way or they will be subject to the enforcement mechanisms of the policy.

Water bills must be paid on or before their due dates. A water bill is considered late after 30 days. After 45 days the meter will be shut off for Non-Payment.

All samples taken have been good. We are currently at 1,179 connections to the water system. The total year to date gallons produced for the overall domestic water system is 16,601,456.

Conservation Tip:

Keep your sprinkler system in good repair. Fix leaks and adjust the sprinkler heads to eliminate overspray. Investigate any source of unusual runoff or puddling.



PRO SHOP NEWS – Don Tracy, PGA Professional

Spring is here and the mountain passes are getting better, which means more of our members with summer homes will be coming back to Desert Aire. Also, our snow birds will be heading back soon. The start of the year was excellent for golf compared to last year. Our Green Fees total year-to-date through February was \$13,747.00 compared to \$2,811.00 for 2017.

March 3rd & 4th we had a booth at the Seattle Golf Show. The show was held at the Century Link Field Event Center across the street from Safeco Field. The show is one of the largest Golf Shows in the western US with more than 12,000 attendees. There was a tremendous interest in Desert Aire. We received over seven hundred new email contacts. Based on the last several years, we expect our golf coupons handed out at the show to bring a significant number of new customers to Desert Aire again this year.

The Winter Best Ball tournament held the weekend of March 17th & 18th was a great success, with a full field of 64 teams and 128 players. Approximately 60% of the participants were outside entrants, all paying Greens Fees, cart rentals, range balls and food / beverage. In addition, all winnings from the tournament proper must be redeemed through the Pro Shop. All the players raved about the condition of the course and the customer service.

April 14th is our Desert Aire Six-Pack Tournament. Make sure to get a partner and stop by the Pro Shop to sign-up or give us a call.

Also, your **Men's Club and Ladies Club dues and GHIN fees were due by February 15th. GHIN posting started March 1st.**

We look forward to seeing every one this spring. The Pro Shop is well stocked with everything you need for your game. The latest demos are available for you to try for a round, including the PING 400 series, Callaway ROGUE and a large variety of wedges and putters.

Remember the start of the season is a great time to take a refresher lesson or to start a series of lessons. It always helps to get back to the fundamentals so you can build confidence in your swing. My lesson fees are \$40.00 for one lesson and \$140.00 for a series of four lessons.

GARBAGE, RECYCLING, ETC.

Garbage Service in Desert Aire is available through Waste Management of Wenatchee at (800) 572-4559. For non full-time residents they even offer a roll out service for a nominal fee. With this you don't even have to roll it out to the street.

The nearest Grant County Solid Waste Drop Box is located on Highway 243 between Desert Aire and Mattawa. You will find it on the east side of the road between Roads 26 and 25. The drop box is tended and is open on Saturdays and Sundays from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. in the summer. Winter hours are 9-4. The minimum fee is \$10.00 for one bag of garbage. Credit cards are not accepted; you may pay with a check or with cash. You may also recycle (free) newspaper, any colored or clear glass bottles & jars, aluminum cans, household & car batteries and used motor oil. For a fee, you may leave household appliances.

The City of Mattawa also has a recycle site on Broadway and First. The green water tower is the landmark to help you find it. You may recycle glass bottles & jars and cardboard only if you are a resident of Mattawa.

Across the street from the Desert Aire office, next to the shop, you may recycle your broken down cardboard and you may recycle used motor oil that is used to heat the shop in the winter. Check with the office or one of our maintenance workers for where and when to leave the oil.

Free Desert Aire Yard Waste Days for Property Owners this season: May 19, Noon-4; June 16, Noon-4; July 21, 9 am-1 pm, Aug. 18, 9am-1pm, Sept. 15, Noon-4, Oct. 20, 9am-1pm. You must bring your owners ID card with you. If you don't have a card, please contact the Desert Aire Business Office at (509) 932-4839.

Our parks and greenways are well maintained but we ask everyone to please help us keep it enjoyable for all members by picking up after your pets. Waste bags are provided at the park and boat launch.

Look elsewhere in this newsletter for the dates and times of our Desert Air Clean-Up Days. Many hands make light work and participating is a good way to meet your neighbors.
